Service Area Training- Summer Camps, Mel Curtis, Moshannon Valley YMCA; Kindergarten Transition, Christal Hayward

Mel Curtis from the Moshannon Valley YMCA discussed a free summer lunch program for children. Food will be given for 5 days. Locations include Philipsburg Elementary School. Osceola Mills School, Moshannon Valley HS, West Branch School, Wingate Elementary, Mt. Top Elementary, Snydertown, Marion Walker Elementary, Continental Courts.

The YMCA is offering a variety of free camps. The mobile unit will be providing a cooking opportunity for ages 11 and up. They will learn to cook meals in the crockpot and get to keep the crockpot.

Starting June 10^{th,} the YMCA will be at Cold Stream every Monday. Feeding children, Penn State Medical Mobile Unit will be there giving free exams. No need to sign up.

Mel discussed several summer camps available to ages 11 and up, teaching children to make salads, pick fruit and make yogurt cups. Food Tasting, Body Impact Program, trying new fruits and vegetables they have never had. Offering camps at the farm-planting vegetables, learn about healthy foods, no costs. Leadership camps. No Cost. Sponsored by a foundation. Tabytha discussed that CenClear owns 400 acres of land that we call the farm. CenClear has partnered with the YMCA among other entities to expand the farm to offer more events/activities to families, free of charge. Looking to offer free family movie nights. Mel suggested following the farm on Facebook. He discussed a bee pollination station being put in, a sensory garden, horse stables are up, no horses yet.

The YMCA is partnering with Diamondback to offer children's cooking classes.

Enrollment-Tabytha discussed that we are still accepting applications for next year. We have some classes that are full but are looking to build a waitlist. Tabytha discussed the parent incentive and encourage parents to refer others.

EHS assessment period, coaching, and transitioning to HS-Ashley Cali discussed the child assessment, our report card, which is used to help us plan, and how that information is used to train staff. Ashley talked about Lisa Clark, coach, who works with staff on professional development. Ashley talked about socializations and how they look different for each caseload. Ashley discussed EHS transitioning, if looking to enroll in a preschool program, encouraged to complete an application, tour a classroom.
