Welcome

Introduction of the Family Community Partnership Director, Mason Strouse-Mason shared his background with participants and his role at CenClear.

Training-Child Development and Child Assessment with Christal Hayward, Child Development Director. Christal informed attendees that her focus would be on 3–5-year-olds. She stated we look at skills a child has at home, school, and in other settings. Assessments and screenings are completed on all children unless they have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) in place, since they already have gone through screenings to get the IEP. Assessment information is also used for transitioning to kindergarten. The kindergarten transition process begins in January unless the child has an IEP then the transition process starts at the beginning of the year. School districts have given positive comments about growth they see with children enrolled in our programs. Our children are independent, problem solvers, good at making friends, etc. We are currently at our second assessment checkpoint. Teachers will be reaching out to review results, parents were encouraged to ask questions. Teachers complete Gold assessments in October, January and April. Once these are completed, parents receive a form reviewing the results. Child goals are based on assessment results and parents should be aware of these goals.

Amy provided some background information about Gold. A committee was formed which consisted of parents and staff to dig deep into curriculum options. The committee compared a variety of curriculums. Pennsylvania has a list of appropriate curriculums. Gold is the most popular type across the country. There is a parent app where parents can view progress.

Screenings are completed within 45 days of a child starting class. We use Heggarty for phonemic awareness. We do not send worksheets home; we want to ensure activities are developmentally appropriate and children learn best when doing hands on learning.
